Tips on planting

Look on the bright side...like a Sunflowerl

Planting indoors

You may want to plant your seeds indoors in the classroom, here are some helpful tips and suggestions;



Use individual pots with drainage holes at the base, fill the pots with compost, poke a small hole in the middle using your finger and pop a seed or two in. Cover over the seed with compost.



Place them on the windowsill in the classroom. keeping them well watered.



Once the seedlings have grown to approx. 15cm in height they can be planted outside.



Once planted, keep them well watered, they will grow very tall so stake them where necessary.




Top Tip!

For planting, use clean empty yoghurt pots with holes punched in the bottom









Planting outdoors



It is recommended to sow sunflower seeds into pots, but if sowing the seeds directly into the soil, ensure the area is free from weeds and grass.



Make 12mm deep holes, with 20cm between each seed. Place the seed in the hole and cover it with plenty of compost.



Water the seeds gently and keep watered until plants are fully established.



The best time to plant sunflower seeds is between **April & June**
